14 – 15 November, 2019, Deakin Downtown, Melbourne, Australia

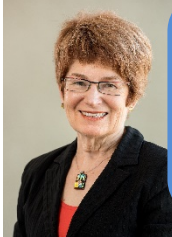

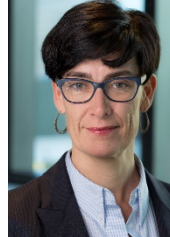
